

Come join us as we welcome Fr. Rick and his wife Debbie!




SEEK Youth Group

King's Forest

Experiencing Nature through the King's Forest

Once upon a time, the line of mesquite trees beside our parking lot marked the southern perimeter of St. Mark's property. Later, Dr. Philip and Lamar Willman and his mother, Patricia Conner, gave us some more land. The majority of that land (two and a half acres) is now dedicated to what we call, "The King's Forest."

What is the King's Forest?

The King's Forest is a "children's forest," a place to play the way we used to play.



It's often the case, isn't it, that when we think of experiencing nature, we imagine heading off to faraway places. But is that really necessary? The purpose of these acres is to provide a secluded but nearby place for children of all ages to enjoy God's creation.

The forest now includes a stand of baby oaks, loblolly pines, Mexican Poinciana, sage, as well as many other trees. Our biggest battles have been in getting the wondrous water feature up and running, keeping trees watered during dry months, and controlling weeds.

Heavy rains blessed the forest last May and early June. Unfortunately, rains came at a time when Fr. John was sick with pericarditis and COVID-19 and then busy preparing the church for his retirement. The weeds got unusually out of control, especially the Johnson Grass, but also K-R Blue Stem (pretty normal for us) and Guinea Grass, invasives from Africa.

Though retired, Fr. John still offers his time mowing, weed-eating, and nurturing this project. His hope is that one day it will be enjoyed by many children and families, as well as classes of school children, into the wonders and beauties of God's creation. He invites everyone to help make it part of their legacy.

While the ground is soft from the rain, clumps of Johnson Grass and other weeds are FAR easier to pull or to uproot with a tool. Instructions are simple: "If it's not a tree, pipe, utility pole or sage bush, pull it!"

We also owe our thanks to Dayna Chimelski who has been so faithful with hand-watering trees over the years, as well as Doug Wayland, who has worked hard on the water feature and irrigation system. At times the Porterfield family has come also out to work with gusto.
