

From the Rector Fr. Doug Wasinger



This coming Sunday we will read from the book of Matthew about a group of people who sought to trap Jesus with a well stated question. Jesus was approached by two groups who normally don't get along and who, in most social settings, would avoid being together. One group of people, the Pharisees, knew their holy scriptures intimately. They were also known to have such a grasp of their faith stories that upon hearing just a few words of scripture, they could identify the book from which the quote came and the larger context for which the words were written. They were like people today who can hear a note or two from a song and immediately identify the song and sing it out loud. The second group of people were called Herodians. They held positions of leadership in government, but most of the people living under their care didn't consider them to be legitimate. It was the Roman Empire that gave Herodians



Planned Giving

Planned Giving

Planned giving encompasses a variety of ways that gifts can be made to the church from accumulated resources. It usually



involves financial or estate planning; however, it is not reserved for the wealthy. Planned giving is a means by which anyone concerned with the wise use of his or her personal resources makes a considered choice about their ultimate disposition. *The Episcopal Church Foundation, "Planned Giving: Steward of God's Bounty."*

In general, planned gifts are made through:

- A beguest in a will or Trust
- · A Life Income Gift
- · Gifts of Special Assets, such as:
- 1. Appreciated stock and securities
- 2. Appreciated real estate
- 3. Qualified Charitable Contribution from IRA/401k RMD
- 4. Designate St. Mark's as beneficiary of all or a percent of life insurance proceeds
- 5. Direct gift to our general fund or to a specific designated fund
- 6. Include St. Mark's as a legacy in your will

Today, I would like to explain the use of a Qualified Charitable Contribution (QCC) from your Traditional IRA or 401(K). If you are currently making Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's), or if you will need to begin taking an RMD due to your age, you can request all or a portion of your RMD to be made to a qualified non-profit, such as St. Mark's. You are normally taxed on the RMD distribution as income. If you utilize the QCC, the amount donated to charity is not taxed. So, you support your favorite charities while reducing the tax owed on your Required Minimum Distribution. The donation check needs to be made out to the charity and can be mailed directly to you or to the charity for personal delivery. Your bank or brokerage firm may have special requirements, so be sure to check with them first. Please feel free to call me with questions.

The icon background is dark purple with a white circle and a purple letter "V" in the center. Download the app and follow the prompts. You can use it to set up a one-time gift or recurring gifts.
- You may also use the QR code below.
- Mail in your check to: St. Mark's Church, 2727 Airline Rd, CC, TX 78414. We
 have a drop-in mailbox that is locked at all times. We check the mail every day,
 so your check will be secure.
- Drop your check off at the church. Just put it in the locked mailbox to the left of the red doors at the fellowship hall.
- Bequest giving is another way to give to St. Mark's with a gift through your estate. Simply list St. Mark's in your will.
