# From the Rector Fr. Doug Wasinger



It is August, and that means that football season is next month. I have my own preseason ritual; I catch up on football documentaries that are streaming on the internet. I am fascinated by the coaches who have placed their livelihoods in the hands of 18- to 21-year-olds. I am curious about how coaches motivate these kids. What are they saying? How are the coaches delivering the often blunt message of needed improvement? More importantly, how are the players responding? The coaches' messages need context to be understood. Without context a person could draw the conclusion that the coaches are angry all the time. They are not angry; they care, and they want their players to be successful.

The common image of Jesus is a man who is calm and gentle. However, there are those passages in the Gospel that show a different side of the Son of God. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus demonstrates a passionate and fiery side of his personality. He tells a large group of people that he came to bring fire to the earth and wishes it was already kindled. In this context, the image of fire implies that there is a pending event of a purge or reckoning. Jesus makes it clear that in this moment what he

is doing will not bring peace to the world, but rather division. In other words, Jesus is going to expose evil, and people will have to make a forced choice: will they continue to follow Jesus or will they embrace the darker side of human nature? Over the course of many years, St. Mark's has partnered with Timon's Ministry in various ways. Timon's goal "is to provide a hand up, empowering individuals to regain their strength, dignity, and ultimately, their place in the workforce." Our women's reunion group has discovered several ways to serve this community.



Members of the group have been volunteering their time at Timon's Ministry working in the Clothing Closet organizing items and visiting with people. The group has asked for help with their efforts through any of the following ways:

- Donating band aids, bandages, and gauze
- Donating clothing, especially men's shirts, jeans, shorts, athletic shoes, flip-flops, socks, and belts and women's jeans, shorts, undergarments, socks, and purses
- Donating sleeping bags, backpacks, tote bags, suitcases, and recyclable plastic bags
- Donating travel size deodorant, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, bars of bath soap, body wash, bath towels
- Donating toothbrushes and new or used shoelaces
- Donating laundry supplies
- Donating items for to-go food bags: tuna and cracker packs, granola bars, chips, bottled water, etc.
- Sorting clothing and helping clients on Mondays from 8:45 noon
